Valentines Day

Where did Valentine's Day originate from? The history of the holiday—and the story of its patron saint—is shrouded in mystery. St. Valentine's Day, as we know it today, contains vestiges of both Christian and ancient Roman tradition.

Tradition recognizes at least three different saints named Valentine or Valentinus, all of whom were martyred. One legend contends that Valentine was a priest who served during the third century in Rome. When Emperor Claudius II decided that single men made better soldiers than those with wives and families, he outlawed marriage for young men. Valentine, realizing the injustice of the decree, defied Claudius and continued to perform marriages for young lovers in secret. When Valentine's actions were discovered, Claudius ordered that he be put to death. Still others insist that it was Saint Valentine of Terni, a bishop, who was the true namesake of the holiday. He, too, was beheaded by Claudius II outside Rome.

The oldest known valentine still in existence today was a poem written in 1415 by Charles, Duke of Orleans, to his wife while he was imprisoned in the Tower of London following his capture at the Battle of Agincourt.

Americans probably began exchanging hand-made valentines in the early 1700s.

Today, according to Hallmark, an estimated 145 million Valentine cards are sent each year, making Valentine's Day the second largest card-sending holiday of the year. More cards are sent at Christmas.

Although the truth behind the Valentine legends **is** murky, the stories all emphasize his appeal as a sympathetic, heroic and—most importantly—romantic figure.

Doorstep News ~ February 2024



Each year has its challenges when it comes to providing basic needs services; often they are the same as

the previous year. In 2023, we saw a sharp increase (88-90%) in the number of households and individuals needing food assistance. Our member congregations answered the call to help, donating an additional 11,608 pounds of food over 2022 for a total of 44,164 pounds of food. We received \$11,000 in Project Topeka funds to purchase food, but we also had to spend an additional \$54,632 out of pocket to keep enough food on the shelves to meet the need. In total, Doorstep provided 127,370 pounds of food to 2,307 households in 2023.

So far in 2023, we are not seeing a decrease in the need for food assistance in our community. And this year having a successful Souper Bowl Sunday weekend is even more important than in year's past. Help us fill those our and show your neighbors you care!

Souper Bowl Sunday is February 11th and we are asking our member congregations to collect soup and crackers that weekend again this year to help stock our food pantry! We can use all varieties of soup, big and small cans, and crackers. A successful Souper Bowl Sunday weekend can stock our pantry with these items into the spring months!

Our goal for 2024 is 5,000 pounds = 2.5 ton!

We set the same goal in 2023 and exceeded it by 3,000 pounds... Let's do it again!!
