World Communion Sunday October 1st



The first Sunday in October is designated as World Communion Sunday, which celebrates our oneness in Christ with all our brothers and sisters around the world. Paul tells us that we are to "discern the body" when we partake of

Holy Communion, mindful that we note our relationship to all our brothers and sisters in Christ in the celebration. It is appropriate that World Communion Sunday is also a time when we receive the annual Peace and Global Witness Offering as a way of continuing the ancient Christian practice of sharing what we have with brothers and sisters in need

World Communion Day is a day of unity, a day when congregations throughout the world will embrace a diverse togetherness throughout the world. This year on October 1st, followers of Jesus Christ will gather in churches of all sizes, on lanes, streets and major highways, in modern buildings and makeshift sanctuaries, in rural and urban environments, all to receive the bread and cup of Holy Communion. Despite the differences in our denominations and traditions, we celebrate our unity in Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior on this Special Sunday.

Doorstep

Happy Fall Y'all! \odot Since April 2023 the need for food assistance has drastically increased! Doorstep has already spent \$25,000 on food purchases this year to keep the pantry stocked and our neighbors fed. This is \$15,000 over what was budgeted, and we still have three months left in 2023. We have provided 12,000 – 14,000 pounds each

month to households in need, and since April we have received an average of 1,800 – 3,000 pounds of food each month. This is a big difference.

We know everyone is struggling, just as we are to keep our shelves stocked to provide a full food order to our neighbors in need. Please give where you can... With the arrival of Fall, the staff and volunteers really ramp up our work on our annual Doorstep Christmas Adoption Project. We plan to adopt 260 households with 800+ individuals from the Christmas Bureau again this year. We are not going back to the Store type set-up we did for many years until the pandemic. However, our families will still receive blankets, health kits, school supplies, toys for children, food for several days, a household item, gifts and \$20 gift cards for everyone in the household. The only new clothing items we will have are hoodies, socks, underwear, and children's winter pajamas. (Scarves, gloves & hats as we have them). We are well stocked on school supplies this year; however, we have very little hygiene products to make health kits for the 260 households. We have these kits made up ahead of time and need to collect the following items in October:

Hygiene Items for the Health Kits ~ Full sized items only please. Shampoo ~ Conditioner (2+1 ok) ~ Bar Soap ~ Deodorant ~ Toothpaste ~ Toothbrushes ~ Combs ~ Brushes. Towel Sets: Bath, Hand & Washcloth.

These can be brought to church on Sunday or during the week but you will need to check with Steph to be sure we are there during the week!

Thank you for your donations! It is still a month away so we can still use more "treasures" for our in-person sale. They can be placed on the floor downstairs in the organized chaos in the big room outside of the office (I promise we do notice they are there!) or let one of us know if you need a pick-up.

Recipe for the month





In an 8x8 pan sprayed with non stick spray, add a small layer of crushed Fritos corn chips. Next add 2 cans chicken, drained (or 1/2 rotisserie chicken chopped). Next layer some shredded Cheddar cheese (a lot or a little). In a bowl, mix 1 can of cream of chicken soup, 1/2 canl of milk, and 1

can of Rotel. Pour this over the chicken and cheese. Do not stir. Top with a few Fritos, if desired. Bake in a 350* oven until hot and bubbly. Serve with sour cream and extra Fritos. This is good leftover, just add some more Fritos, of course!
